What is punishment?

Expectations should be consistent with the age and stage of the child's development. Good disciplinary practices include

- positive reinforcement
- praise
- modeling
- structure and routine
- setting and maintaining limits
- realistic expectations
- follow through
- verbal and non-verbal cues
- time outs
- logical consequences
- problem-solving

What will CAS do if I call them about a child that is being physically harmed by their caretakers?

- The Children's Aid Society will investigate cases where there is credible evidence that a child has been physically harmed or is at risk of physical harm
- CAS will investigate and take appropriate steps to protect the child
- CAS will offer counselling on different and appropriate methods of child management

If the child is not safe in the family home, then the Children's Aid Society must make a plan to protect the child.

Wherever possible, the Children's Aid Society works with the child in the context of his own family home.

The Children's Aid Society works with many children in their own family homes.
